# Testing

- · Unit tests (dates vary)
- · Pre-test (county-wide test, August/September)
- · Mid-course exam (county-wide test, January)
- · 6th grade PARCC Reading and Math (mid-March)
- Post-test: End of course exam (county-wide test completed mid-May to early June)

### Grading

#### Process (30% of student's grade)

- Tasks that promote student learning and include:
  - Work done in class,
  - Laboratories (some parts may be considered product)
  - Work done at home

#### Product (70% of student's grade)

- Tasks that measure student learning and include:
  - Laboratories (some parts may be considered process)
  - Quizzes
  - Unit tests (Recovery permitted)
    - County benchmarks (Recovery permitted)

# Classroom Expectations
